



#### **Aviation:** Land Development





- 9 aerospace, defense, and advanced manufacturing companies have begun operating out of the Innovation Factory – 13 companies currently on a wait list
- New companies already have positive impact on local suppliers' growth
- Deal flow at 21 companies with 6 strong new leads for 2024

### **Aviation:** Operations and Security

- El Paso is national leader in detection and tracking of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) or "drones"
- Community engagement and education continues to promote safe drone operations
- International Drone Day, May 4th at Kids to Parks Event
- Leveraged partnerships with organizations and federal agencies to expand drone detection operations
- Work has continued to set up systems to allow operations beyond the visual line of sight (BVLOS)
- This will allow the COEP to maximize the efficacy of coverage based on EPPD and EPFD needs

## **Destination El Paso**

- **Occupancy** continues to lead state and national averages and other TX MSAs, **averaging 69%**
- More than 11k rooms city-wide, representing all major hotel brands, 500+ new rooms currently under construction
- Consistent flow of high impact convention bookings, including 2022 Texas Society of Architects, 2023 Neighborhoods USA, and 2024 Texas Democratic Party, 2026 WireTech
- Welcomed 16,000+ visitors to Magic of Lights, drive-through holiday lights experience, at Camp Cohen
- Sold over 14,400 tickets to Broadway in El Paso's Aladdin, across 8 performances
- Increased sales and marketing efforts resulting in securing of touring entertainment bookings for performing arts venues and ranked **44th in attendance** and 45th in gross ticket sales worldwide in **Pollstar**



#### **Economic Development: Industry Development**

#### Accelerate Quality Job + Wage Growth Investment

- Performance-based agreement for the expansion of *Schneider Electric* approved, making El Paso its largest manufacturing footprint in the U.S. and securing a more than \$17 million investment, 370 new jobs, and the retention of 1,130 existing jobs
- A \$70M expansion by *Eaton Corporation* will create 575 Full-times jobs and retain 300 full time jobs, operations directly support 875 jobs and annual salaries of \$50M+ annually, while through spending, an additional 960+ jobs are indirectly supported in total, nearly 1,840 jobs are supported, representing \$48k in average annual salaries per job
- *Meta* will build an \$800M Phase 1 of 5 Hyperscale Data Center, the construction will generate hundreds of temporary jobs; operational roles offer steady high value-added employment for residents as technicians and engineers. Over the next 25 years, Meta will construct an additional 4 phase and replenishment of equipment will lead to a total investment of over \$4 billion.

  - Updated the Project and Finance Plan
  - Dedicated \$800K for the Downtown Tree Master Plan implementation Phase 1 Main St.
  - Façade Grant Program \$22k distributed Q1





### International Bridges: Capital Improvement Program

- Investing over \$50 million on improvements and technology enhancements for our bridge system
  - **\$32 million for ITS design and implementation** for BOTA and Ysleta-Zaragoza
  - **\$12 million RAISE grant agreement** for pedestrian improvements at Ysleta-Zaragoza bridge
  - **\$2 million RCN grant awarded** for a project development study at PdN and Stanton bridges



## International Bridges: Parking Meters

- Parking Meter Upgrades
  - Bilingual instructions
  - Additional gateways for enhanced connectivity between parking meters and the Park 915 app
  - Bigger housings to increase security and coin capacity

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## **Planning & Inspections**

- Over 2,300 postcards sent to property owners in Historic Districts **generated reduced rate** of unpermitted construction
- Promote pre-application/construction meetings for customized approach to future developments, saving customers time and money
- Consistent effort to ensure compliance with State and Local regulations and requirements generated additional revenue to the City
  - Example: local Alcohol License sweep generated \$169,000 and brought businesses into compliance
