## City of El Paso Public Library Recognized as One of Best in State

**EL PASO**, **Texas** – The City of El Paso is proud to announce that the El Paso Public Library has received the 2022 Achievement of Library Excellence Award from the Texas Municipal Library Directors Association (TMLDA), an affiliate of the Texas Municipal League.

"We are greatly honored to have received this distinction for the fourth time in a row," said El Paso Public Library Director Norma Martinez. "More than anything it emphasizes our library staff's hard work and dedication to our community."

Of the 552 public libraries in Texas, only 73 received this award in 2022. To successfully receive the Achievement of Library Excellence Award, the library must exhibit excellence by providing services to underserved and special populations, marketing in innovative ways, pursuing collaborative efforts, continually enhancing its services, supporting literacy, digital inclusion, and workforce development that provides cultural, topical, and educational programming, and comprehensively training its staff.

The award recognizes the Library and the City of El Paso's continued dedication to providing outstanding recreational, cultural and educational opportunities for our community.

The El Paso Public Library previously received the Achievement of Excellence Award in 2017, 2019, 2020 and 2021.
