Beat the heat with discounts in June. Every Wednesday through Friday when temperatures hit 100 degrees, the prices come down. All visitors will receive a \$2 discount on admission tickets.

Animals enjoy ice pop enrichment treats throughout the day. The enrichment treats are provided to the animals for mental and physical stimulation in their daily lives. Zoo animals enjoy cooling down with ice pop treats, and this activity provides a fun and unique experience for them and Zoo visitors.

Visitors can also cool down with their very own special frozen treats, like Fruitiki popsicles, Dippin’ Dots ice cream, ice cream cones, ICEEs, cold agua frescas, and more from the Zoo’s concession stands, the “Beastro Kiosk.” Visitors 21 and older can even get a frozen margarita or ice-cold beer to cool off.
